

Indefinite Pronouns

	Person	Place	Thing
All	everyone everybody	everywhere	everything
Part (positive)	someone somebody	somewhere	something
Part (negative)	anyone anybody	anywhere	anything
None	no one nobody	nowhere	nothing

EXAMPLES

Indefinite Pronouns and Adjectives

- 1. I want to go somewhere <u>nice</u> to eat.
- 2. I'm going to buy something expensive for her.

Indefinite Pronouns and Nouns

- 1. I'll go anywhere that has a pool.
- 2. I'd like to date someone with a fast <u>car</u>.

Indefinite Pronouns and Verbs

- 1. I want to go to karaoke with anyone that sings well.
- 2. I like everyone that enjoys a good beer.

Indefinite Pronouns and Auxiliary Verbs

- 1. I don't like anybody that <u>can't</u> be positive.
- 2. I need to go somewhere where you can buy fresh vegetables.

Indefinite Pronouns and Prepositions

- 1. I don't want to do anything <u>during</u> my vacation.
- 2. I want to go somewhere <u>in</u> America.
